# Prospects for Pentwater Township if Pentwater Village becomes a City

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President

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- Founded in 1916
- Statewide
- Non-partisan
- Private not-for-profit
- Promotes sound policy for state and local governments through factual research – accurate, independent and objective
- Relies on charitable contributions from Michigan foundations, businesses, and individuals
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### Local Government Service Delivery Responsibilities

Cities, Villages, and Townships

#### 2 classes of services

- Legally required services (cities and townships):
  - 1. Assessing property as a basis of state, county, and school taxes
  - 2. Collecting taxes for the state, counties, and schools
  - 3. Conducting county, state, and national elections
- Elected services (cities, villages, and townships):
  - Fire protection, police protection, water supply, sewage disposal, zoning, public health, etc.



### Village Government


- Remain part of township village residents are also township residents
- In original design of Michigan local government village government was a stepping-stone to becoming a city
  - Furnish local governments services to residents of a built-up area in the township
- With expanded statutory authority of townships, little reason to create new villages
  - Last village incorporated in 1980
  - Many townships have transitioned directly to cities




## Population of Pentwater Township, Inside and Outside of Pentwater Village, 1980 to 2020






## Median Age of Residents in Pentwater Village and Township, 2020






## Median Household Income of Residents in Pentwater Village and Township, 2020





## Composition of Pentwater Township Property Tax Base, 2022






## State Equalized Value and Taxable Value of Peer Townships (exclusive of townships with villages), 2022






## Tax Rates Levied by Pentwater Township's Peer Townships

### Budget Impact



### Pentwater Township Revenues, FY2022-23

- \$558,449 in General Fund Revenue
  - 57% from property taxes
  - 15% from administrative fees
  - 17% from state revenue sharing
  - 11% from minor taxes, charges, and other sources
- If the village incorporates as a city, Pentwater Township
  - Revenues would be expected to decrease by 35% as a result of the loss of the tax base and other assumed changes

### Potential Tax Rate Change

- On the high end
  - Without any reductions in spending
  - The township would have to increase its property tax rate by 1.4 mills to make up for the lost tax base in order to maintain current service levels
- Our hypothetical cuts were not enough to align with expected revenue reductions
  - The township would have to increase its property tax rate by 0.3 mills to maintain a balanced budget
  - Make deeper cuts
  - Or a combination of these actions
- All tax rate increase proposals would have to be submitted to the voters for approval

### **Annexation Processes**

#### Village

- Petition county board of commissioners to approve boundary changes
- Commission hearing
- Yes/No Vote of 5 Oceana County Commissioners
  - District 1 represents Pentwater, Claybanks, Benona, and Golden Townships

#### City

- Vacant property may be purchased by city and adopting annexation resolution
- Petition State Boundary Commission
- Commission hearing
- Opportunity for referendum

### Summary

#### Advantage

- Township has a relatively large property tax base to survive on its own
- Potential to use intergovernmental agreements to maintain fire, library, cemetery, refuse transfer, recreation

#### Disadvantages

- Will require either
  - Significant service level reduction
  - Tax increase
  - Or combination of cuts and new taxes
- Intergovernmental agreements require two willing partners so not a certainty

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
